SHORT ACADEMIC HISTORY

Jacobsson began his PhD studies in 2006, defended his licentiate thesis in 2008, and earned his doctorate in the spring of 2011. Later that year, he secured a two-year post-doctoral position and was promoted to Assistant Professor after receiving honours for his teaching and research. By 2012, he had become Head of the Management Section at Umeå School of Business, Economics and Statistics and during the subsequent years, he had the privilege to spend periods as a visiting scholar at both RMIT University in Melbourne, Australia (2012-2013), and at Virginia Tech in Blacksburg, United States (2014-2015).

In February 2014, Jacobsson was promoted to Associate Professor (Swe. Docent), and by 2016, he had expanded his academic role, joining Jönköping University as a part-time researcher while qualifying as a Professor of Project Management at the University of Agder, Norway (ranked #1 out of 19 applicants). From 2018 to 2022, he also acted as a project/program manager for two development initiatives at Umeå University, one focused on Executive education and one dedicated to reducing sick leave and improving the performance of Doctoral students across the university.

Throughout his career, Jacobsson has led and participated in numerous research projects, published about 35 articles in peer-reviewed journals, and received six Best Paper Awards and two

Outstanding Reviewer Awards. He has also taught courses and supervised at the undergraduate, master's, and doctoral levels. He is a Distinguished teacher (Swe. Excellent lärare) and the current Director of Doctoral Studies in Business Administration at Umeå School of Business, Economics, and Statistics, Umeå University.
